Up for discussion

- Focus on annotation framework instead of client
 - DoW, T 5.6 states "Existing annotation frameworks (Annotea, OpenAnnotationArchitecture, etc) will be analyzed and compared with the requirements of SSH researchers. An annotation framework will be provided that can handle essential SSH requirements."
 - Current version of specification document available in Basecamp focuses on the client: "DASISH WEB-ANNOTATOR. This document specifies a browser extension for annotating web-documents. We present the class structure of the implementation, describe the functionality from the user perspective and define the REST API."

- Title
 - Suggestion for a preliminary title: "The DASISH Web Service Annotation Framework: A Facilitator for Shared Data Access and Enrichment within the SSH Domain"
- Abstract composition, distribution of contributions





Up for discussion - Continued

- Moves to be covered:
 - Move 1: Outlining/promoting/problematizing the research field or topic
 - Move 2: Justifying this particular piece of research/study
 - Move 3: Methodological, demographic, or procedural comments
 - Move 4: Summarizing the main findings
 - Move 5: Highlighting its outcome/results
 - Move 6: Further observations (implications, limitations, future developments)
- Different sections for: Framework specification, REST API, RESTful web service backend and database, client

- Special requirements: Your abstract must consist of 1500 to 2000 words and must be formatted in PDF. An abstract of 1500-2000 words is about 3-4 pages and can contain references, tables, figures. (see: http://lrec2014.lrec-conf.org/en/submission/submit-abstract/)
- Submission needs to be characterized by defining a track and three topic areas
- Deadline is 15 October 2013
